# Of the Same Flesh: exploring a theology of gender

This report provides a theological underpinning for gender justice work by exploring a theology of gender. Theology is a key sphere where gender is explored and the voices of church leaders across the world are powerful in shaping social norms and practices. Recurring topics in the report include the radical nature of the scriptural witness on gender, the insight that human beings may be different yet also 'of the same flesh', and the way in which experience of gender may be shaped by oppression or by justice.
